WE ARE COMMITTED TO OUR VETERANS

Tent 23 continues to support our homeless veterans as well as those who live in our communities, attend our higher education programs and reside in or are temporary patients at our state veterans homes and hospitals.

Linda Tanner-Frietag recently participated in the STAND DOWN event held in Madison on October 21st -22nd. Stand Downs are typically one to three day events during which VA staff and volunteers provide food, clothing and health screenings to homeless and at-risk Veterans. In addition, Veterans also receive referrals for health care, housing solutions, employment, substance use treatment, mental health counseling and other essential services. She reported that she distributed 90 cards for veterans day, (3) \$20 Kwik trip gift certificates were distributed as well as underwear, socks and puzzle books totaling \$250 in donations. 200 coats were also donated by Lands End.

Our Walworth County veterans will receive cards through postal mail honoring them for their service to our country. We have committed to this since we chartered our Tent in 2012.

Tent 23 will support the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation Homeless Veterans Shelter with a \$200 donation for Charlene Staples to purchase needed supplies on their wish list. Staples will travel to the Reservation in late November to deliver our donations.






