Peter Anthony Noblet 47th Wisconsin Infantry, Co. B

Peter Anthony Noblet was the son of Pierre Noblet who came to America in 1837 after serving seven years in the French army. Pierre located in Spring Prairie, Walworth County, Wisconsin where he married Lydia Ann Baker in 1840. Their son, Peter Anthony, was born May 4, 1846. He was one of ten children. In December of 1845 three sons of Pierre and one of his daughters died, most probably due to the raging cholera epidemic sweeping Wisconsin.

The patriotic Noblet family had several men serve in the Union Army during the Civil War. Peter had lived next to his Uncle Alexander Noblet who served with the 47th Wisconsin Infantry. His Uncle Anthony, Jr. served as a quarter master in the 3rd Wisconsin Cavalry. Noblet, himself, enlisted in the 47th Wisconsin Infantry, Co. B. His brother Joseph was a corporal in the 28th Wisconsin while another brother served in the 47th Wisconsin. Noblet's father, Pierre (Peter) was a sergeant in the 28th Wisconsin, Co. I.



Noblet enlisted on January 23, 1865 as a private at East Troy, WI for a term of one year service. Mustered in on February 15, 1865, he was reported sick for roll call in Madison. In August of 1865 he was hospitalized in Tullahoma, TN where he had been attached to the 2nd Brigade defending Nashville and the Chattanooga Railroad. He was mustered out of service on August 29, 1865 at Madison, WI.

Noblet returned to Walworth County where he married Emma Alexander. They had two sons.
