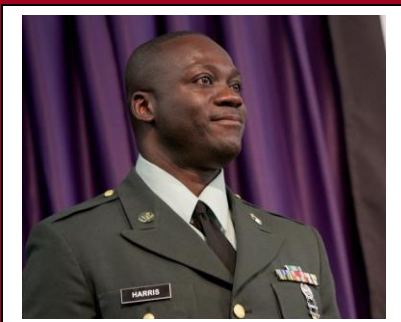

D of the 3rd Wisconsin Infantry as a private in December of 1864. After the war he was a member of the A.J. Fullerton Post of the GAR located in West Bend, WI We are looking forward to initiating Mary into the order at our April meeting!

JOHN GILBERT DORN

On behalf of the SUVCW, Camp #15, Tent #23 will place a "Last Soldier" commemorative marker on the gravesite of John Gilbert Dorn who is buried at the Oakwood Cemetery in Beloit.

Dorn was born on March 30, 1844 in Pennsylvania. He enlisted in Co. C of the 3rd Wisconsin Volunteer Infantry on August 18, 1864 in Janesville. He was extremely proud of his experience when he marched in review before President Abraham Lincoln in Washington, D.C. where he was mustered out of service on June 9, 1865.

Dorn passed away on March 30, 1944 at his home in Beloit at the age of 96 after a brief illness. He was the last Civil War Veteran to be buried in Rock County and until his death, the only surviving member of the L.H. D. Crane Post of the GAR.

Dorn was survived by a large family to include five sons and four daughters. His wife, Uretta had preceded him in death passing away in 1920. She is also buried at Oakwood Cemetery.

Plans are underway to place the marker for Dorn at his gravesite this spring or early summer.

Dorn is one of two "Last Soldiers" that the Tent will honor. The second Civil War Veteran to be honored will be Christian Holzhueter II who is the "Last Soldier" of Jefferson County. He enlisted in the First Wisconsin Heavy Artillery at the age of 17. Holzhueter passed away in 1941 at the age of 94.
