

#### **CELEBRATE MEMORIAL DAY: MAY 30, 2022**

The national holiday was established to honor those who have died in American wars. Memorial Day was originally called Decoration Day. It originated during the American Civil War, when citizens would place flowers on the graves of those who had been killed in battle.

To continue the mission of the DUVCW, Tent 23 made wreaths at their April meeting to commemorate those ancestral fathers who gave their lives to protect the Union. The Tent donated wreaths to the Southern Memorial and Wreath project conducted by the National DUVCW. The wreaths were sent to the Memphis and Corinth National Cemeteries to honor the Union soldiers buried there. The Tent also made wreaths to honor their namesake, Mary Chesebro Lee, as well as family buried at the Spring Grove Cemetery in Delavan. # HONORING THOSE WHO DESERVE (TENT 23 HONORS A JROTC FEMALE CADET)

Peiton Greenfield, a graduating senior in the Beloit Memorial High School JROTC (Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps) was honored by the Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War 1861-1865 (DUVCW), Mary Chesebro Lee Tent 23 of Delavan, Wisconsin. Greenfield received the prestigious bronze medal and a certificate from the organization.

In attendance at the awards program were Tent 23 members, Linda Tanner-Frietag and Pat Blackmer who presented Greenfield with the award. This is the first time that Tent 23 has honored a high school cadet.

Cadet Greenfield plans on attending the University of Wisconsin-Whitewater as an ROTC cadet where she will study military science and social work. Upon graduation from college, she plans to enter the army.

The DUVCW requirements for the award include that the recipient demonstrates loyalty and patriotism and has earned a record of military and scholastic achievements during her participation in the JROTC program. In addition, the individual must have shown the qualities of dependability, good character, adherence to military discipline and leadership.

The selection of a cadet to receive the award is made by the instructors of the military science program at the school. From Greenfield's selection it is apparent that she not only meets but exceeds the requirements for the award. These young adults are the future of the United States and the Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War, 1861-1865 is proud to acknowledge their achievements.
