PRIVATE STEPHEN KEISER HONORED FOR HIS SERVICE BY THE ALLIED ORDERS

On Saturday, October 26th the Allied Orders honored Stephen Keiser, Co. D of the 16th Wisconsin Infantry. Because of a grave misunderstanding 126 years ago, the First German Evangelical Church in Racine did not conduct a funeral service allowing the Grand Army of the Republic to provide ritual practices that they used at a funeral for a comrade. Present to honor Keiser at this gravesite were the Woman's Relief Corps, the Ladies of the Grand Army of the Republic, Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War, 1865-1861, Sons of the Union Veterans of the Civil War, and the Auxiliary to the Sons of Union Veterans.



The SUVCW provided a rifle salute, a guard for the gravesite, while Susan Fallon was emcee for the event. The allied orders laid wreaths to honor Keiser as the event closed with "Taps".







The Allied Orders conducted a GAR Service from 1917 for Keiser at the Mound Cemetery in Racine "keeping Green his memory".

CEREMONIAL DRUM TRANSFER AND DEDICATION

November 9th, SUVCW Camp 2 Col. Henry Harnden and the SVR Co. B of the WI Volunteer Infantry conducted a ceremonial drum transfer to Jr. Patriotic Instructor, Felix Clemens. On hand at the ceremony, held at Camp Randle Memorial Park at the GAR Arch were Linda Tanner-Freitag and Pat Blackmer, Clemen's family and members of Camp 2.

Clemens assumed the role of drummer boy for the camp and has learned the 26 drum rolls that were required of a Civil War drummer boy. During the war these young boys, ages 12 to 17 were essential to maintaining the northern war effort. Not only did the drummer signal to the troops what they were to do, but he also provided the cadence for marching and assisted the medical personnel when needed. These young men were brave, courageous and patriotic.
