She comes from a military family who has served our country well. Her grandparents Roy and Florence Cobb resided in Delavan. Grandfather Roy was a member of U.S. Navy and served in the Pacific Theatre during WWII where he was an underwater demolition expert or as Charlene describes his service... “a Navy Seal”. Her father was stationed in Europe as a member of the U.S. Army during WWII. He was wounded during the war in France and received the distinguished Purple Heart for his service.

Cobb is active in Veterans affairs. She is currently assisting with the Veterans Resource Fair which will be held at the Walworth County Health and Human Services Building, 1910 County Road NN in Elkhorn on Saturday, August 19th from 10:00 a.m.- 1:00 p.m. The program is sponsored by Veterans Outreach of Wisconsin and the Walworth County Veterans Service Office headed by Nathan Bond.
